Narrative

regarding a 594(a) PC that had just occurred at Powerline Six, 49 Pier Plaza. Computed that he had seen a black male brake a window at the above address and then walk to the parking structure, 1301 Hermosa Avenue, with two other black males. He said subjects then entered a silver colored four door vehicle.

Officer Brunn and Officer Sellan #168 responded to the parking structure and located a silver colored four door vehicle occupied by three black males attempting to leave the location. While initiating a traffic stop on the vehicle, the officers noticed that the subject sitting in the front passenger's seat had his arm sticking out of the opened front passenger's side window. This passenger's arm was bleeding. I (Droz) #173 then arrived on scene and detained these three occupants for investigation.

During further investigation it was determined that one of the occupants,

While talking to a lobserved a cloth covering his right hand that was saturated and dripping with blood. The Hermosa Beach Fire Department responded to the scene and provided medical aid to the who had sustained a three inch laceration to his right wrist. While being treated by admitted to punching a glass window near the pier and breaking it, causing the cut to his right wrist. The related that he punched the window because he was upset but did not elaborate why. While talking to he exhibited objective signs and symptoms of alcohol intoxication: he had bloodshot/watery eyes, a lack of physical coordination, and slurred speech.

I was advised by Officer Brunn that there was a witness to the incident in the unit block of 13th Court. I responded to the area and located the witness, Officer Brunn that Street and he told me the following.

He was standing next to his truck in the northwest corner of parking lot B, 2 13th Street, and heard a loud noise. Combined toward the source of the noise and saw a black male standing on the north side of 49 Pier Plaza with his arm extended through a glass window. This subject was at that location with two other black males. All three subjects then walked to the parking structure. Combined them get into a silver four door vehicle. Officer black made advised him that he observed them get into a silver four door vehicle. Officer black him ever to the ambiliance that was sitting in. Combined positively identified as the subject who he had seen with his arm extended through the window. At that time was transported to the Little Company of Mary Hospital for further medical treatment by HBFD ambulance 12.

I then inspected the damaged property. The damaged window is located on the lower left corner of the north side of Powerline Six, 49 Pier Plaza. The window is approximately 1

square feet and has a large hole broken in it that is consistent with having been punched. There was also fresh blood spatter on the ground outside of the window.

I attempted to contact the victim who is responsible for 49 Pier Plaza with negative results. I did contact the owner of a neighboring business, who gave me the first name of Chip (unknown last) and a contact telephone number of the victim. A message was left on Chip's voicemail informing him of the damage. Victor said he would attempt to temporarily patch up the broken window.

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Narrative

Based on the statement and positive identification provided by C déscribed by Firefighter Soriano, I determined that was the suspect who punched the window at 49 Pier Avenue. Due to injuries, I decided not to arrest him on scene.
