### OVERCROWDING / HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS INVESTIGATION REPORT

### **SUMMARY OF INCIDENT**

On March 15, 2008, at 1527 hours, Hermosa Beach Police Officers Sellan, Kansaku and Fire Investigator Powers responded to Hennesey's Tavern for a Fire Code / Life Safety Inspection. Upon entering the business, gross overcrowding conditions were observed. After an occupant load count established there were 233 persons inside the business, it was determined that Hennesey's Tavern was 125% (129 persons) over the posted maximum allowable occupant load of 104 persons. Citation number H 377134 was issued to owner, Paul E. Hennesey, for violation of California Fire Code section 107.6-Overcrowding.

### **DETAILS**

In the course of conducting Fire Code / Life Safety Inspections immediately following the Annual Hermosa Beach Saint Patrick's Day Parade, our attention was drawn to Hennesey's Tavern by the extreme amount of patrons both inside the business, outside on the patio and waiting in line.

At 1527 hours, upon arriving at the business, Officers Sellan, Kansaku and I contacted Doorman TYRONE ANTONIO RUSH, DOB , and advised him of the nature of our inspection and requested a current occupant load count. Rush exhibited difficulties in trying to determine the current occupant load count by first looking at his two clickers and then referring to a notebook tablet located on a kiosk, where the door hostess was seated. Eventually, Rush responded to my question by stating, "The current count is 219, inside and up." We advised Rush that from our vantage point outside, the bar looked to be more crowded than the current count he had provided and we would be conducting an inspection and occupant load count. Rush's statement that he currently had 219 persons "inside and up", should be considered an admission that at the time we contacted him, the bar was minimally, 69 persons over the posted maximum allowable occupant load of 150 persons for the Inside Main Dining and Upstairs Patio Areas.

Upon entering the Inside Main Dining Area of the business, Officers Sellan, Kansaku and I all observed gross overcrowding conditions present. Dining tables were pushed together to seat large groups of patrons drinking and all other remaining aisles and exit ways were overcrowded with standing patrons.

### **INTERIOR OCCUPANT LOAD COUNT**

To obtain an accurate current occupant load count, Officers Sellan, Kansaku and I splitup and counted separate sections of the business. Using mechanical counters (clickers), Officer Sellan first counted the West and South bar areas of the Main Inside Dining Area, I counted the East side of the Main Inside Dining Area and Officer Kansaku counted the Upstairs Patio Area. After reporting the occupant load count from the West and South portions of the bar to me, Officer Sellan counted the Outside Patio Area, on Pier Plaza.

Upon completion of the occupant load count, Officer Sellan reported to me that he counted 114 occupants in the West and South portions of the Main Inside Dining Area and 64 occupants on the Outside Patio Area. Officer Kansaku reported that he counted 46 occupants on the Upstairs Patio Area and I counted 119 occupants in the East side bar area of the Main Inside Dining Area.

Based on occupant load counts at the time of our inspection, Officers Sellan, Kansaku and I, determined the Main Inside Dining Area occupant load to be 233 persons, 129 persons (125%) over the posted maximum allowable occupant load of 104 persons. Through other Hennesey's employees, we identified the on-duty manager and asked him to step outside for issuance of an overcrowding citation.

Once outside, I asked the on-duty Manager to produce ID, which he did and then I asked him if the owner was present. The Manager responded, "Yes, Paul Hennesey is here somewhere." I asked him to please bring Mr. Hennesey to my location outside. A short time later, Paul Hennesey responded to my location with the Manager. I advised both parties that they would be receiving citations for overcrowding, at which time Hennesey said he would take full responsibility for the overcrowding situation and requested that I only issue a citation to him and not his Manager. I honored Hennesey's request for issuance of only one citation.

### **OWNER INTERVIEW**

After asking the on-duty Manager to locate the owner and bring him to my location, PAUL E. HENNESEY, DOB responded to my location outside the bar to discuss the overcrowding conditions present. Prior to responding to my location, Hennesey was inside the bar with other patrons.

After advising Hennesey of the overcrowding conditions present, I requested his ID for issuance of a citation. Hennesey immediately produced his ID when requested. When advised of the overcrowding conditions present in the Main Inside Dining Area, Hennesey provided no defense for the violation but stated, "It got windy out here (pointing to outdoor patio), so we allowed people to go in, and then when it (wind) died down, we were going to fill the patio with the line." I explained to Hennesey that immediate measures needed to be taken to reduce the overcrowding inside. Hennesey was very cooperative stating, "We will do whatever needs to be done."

While I began issuing a citation to Hennesey, Officers Sellan, Kansaku and I put a hazard abatement plan in place.

### **HAZARD ABATEMENT ACTIONS**

Due to the fact there were already large crowds outside Hennesey's, both in line and listening to a live band about twenty feet away from the main entrance, we decided to exit patrons out of Hennesey's until they were at their maximum allowable occupant load of 104 persons, rather than exit all 233 persons onto the Plaza.

While I issued Citation # H377134 to Hennesey, Officers Sellan and Kansaku, supervised the orderly evacuation of patrons down to the posted allowable maximum of 104 persons in the Main Inside Dining Area. When the occupant load had been reduced, we instructed the doorman Rush, to reset his clickers to reflect the correct and a current occupant load and then we left the location after Hennesey was issued a citation.


