Regular Meeting of January 24, 2006

Approval of an Extension to Contract for Third Party Administration of Workers' Compensation Claims

Recommendation:

That the City Council approve a six month extension to the contract with Hazelrigg Risk Management Services for third party administration of the City's Workers' Compensation claims.

Background:

The contract with the existing third party administrator of the City's workers' compensation claims, Hazelrigg Risk Management Services, became effective January 1, 2001. The contract was for a three year term and provided an option for extending an additional two years. The City exercised the extension option and the contract expired on December 31, 2005.

Analysis:

Ongoing administration of the City's workers' compensation claims is an important contracted service. As the existing contract expired on December 31, 2005, an extension is necessary so that staff may fully analyze the service currently provided and the workers' compensation claims program overall. Since the last request for proposal process for third party claims administration services was completed, considerable evaluation of member cities' workers compensation claims programs has been completed by the Independent Cities Risk Management Authority (ICRMA). ICRMA completed a request for proposal process with the goal of requiring member cities to use an authorized third party administrator. While the mandatory utilization of a particular administrator was not ultimately approved by the ICRMA governing board, the committee did complete an extensive evaluation of service providers. ICRMA has also been working on developing recommended performance standards for use by member cities who contract for third party claims administration. It has yet to be determined wheather these standards will become mandatory for cities participating in the ICRMA workers' compensation program; however, they will likely be useful to cities that want to ensure a high level of claims administration service. Staff anticipates using much of the evaluation standards and criteria developed by ICRMA in evaluating future service for the City of Hermosa Beach.

Fiscal Impact:

The fiscal impact of approving the contract extension with HRMS will result in an expenditure of \$14,323 for the six month period of January 1, 2006 through June 30, 2006. There is no change proposed from the current rate and funds are included in the current year budget.


