<b>CIVIC THEATER FEE WAIVER FOR SANDPIPERS</b>

### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Parks, Recreation and Community Resources Commission waive performance/rental fees, clean up fees and damage deposits as requested by the Sandpipers for the use of the Civic and 2<sup>nd</sup> Story Theaters for their two (2) general membership meetings and a fashion show between November 2002 and March 2003.

### **Background**

Staff received a letter from the Sandpipers requesting that the performance fees (\$100) and damage deposit (\$100) be waived for each of their two general membership meetings scheduled for November 12, 2002 and March 11, 2003. The Sandpipers are aware they will incur a direct cost for staff fees for each meeting.

Sandpipers are a non-profit philanthropic organization founded in Hermosa Beach over 60 years ago. They support many Hermosa Beach charities such as the 1736 House, Project Touch, the South Bay Free Clinic, and the Hermosa Beach Coordinating Council.

### **Analysis**

The Commission has considered and approved the fee waiver request for the past several years. This has been done in recognition of the organization's significant contributions to the community and to maximize the dollars they have available to donate to local charities.
